

I would like to thank the school for supporting my involvement in the external validation process for NSW Public Schools during Term 3 and Term 4.

Every year NSW Public Schools are required to self-assess against the School Excellence Framework. The findings are then reported to the school community through the Annual School Report.

Every five years we are required to self-assess against the School Excellence Framework and provide evidence of our judgements to an external validation panel.

In Term 3 I was privileged to be a peer support for an inner city school as they went through their school validation. Wow, so different to a mountains school in so many ways yet we work towards the same outcomes. It was a wonderful learning environment to experience and share in the fabulous work the school was engaging in and to see how their evaluative reflections for the future of student wellbeing and learning would form part of their planning for 2019 onwards.

This term I was excited to be visiting a school in Tamworth. What a great place! I felt quite humble listening to and seeing how the staff works with their students. As a school for specific purposes meeting the complex needs of young people can be challenging and quite complicated. The experience was awe inspiring and I walked away wishing people knew how incredible most teachers are.

These experiences continue to affirm my belief in NSW Public Education, my belief in the relationships teachers build with their students, my belief in the care those teachers have for each and every student's wellbeing and learning and their ongoing commitment to doing the very best they can for their school communities.

I came away with some great examples of teacher induction procedures that we will look at for 2019.

On Monday 29th October, after class, all teachers will be involved in a meeting to begin the 2019 organisational structures for school leadership and classes.

On Tuesday 30th October, the school executive will look at the expressions of interest submitted for available temporary positions. Applicants will be notified of the outcomes Tuesday afternoon.

On Wednesday 31st October or possibly Wednesday 7th November a vacant position for Hazelbrook Public School will go to advertisement in '*I work for NSW*'. The position requirements are with the Department of Education ready for the Human Resources Directorate to approve.

It has been a busy start to Term 4 and we have lots on the agenda. I am really looking forward to beginning a coaching course with our school executive in Week 4 here at Hazelbrook. Jane Davies, the Principal of Blackheath and I will be supporting all school executive throughout the Blue Mountains who wish to develop coaching skills through the newly established Blue Mountains Learning Alliance. This is a very exciting project which is guided by our Director of Education and Learning, Jennifer Thompson. Our vision is to build the capacity of all our schools to provide better practices and improve learning for students and staff in all our schools that results in exemplary outcomes.
