Dear Families,

Welcome to Term 3, Week 2.

We are looking forward to our athletics carnival this Friday. As much as we love and need the rain we are hoping the sun shines for us. As previously mentioned, for us to go be able to proceed with the carnival we must adhere to strict guidelines. Adhering to these guidelines will mean that we need to restrict parent and carer access. If you do choose to attend the carnival as spectators, there will be bunting to mark out the carnival area and we request that parents and carers responsibly social distance on the outside of the bunting.

Thank you to Mr Scott for all of the time and effort he went to preparing a full 30 minutes of fun and laughter for our Term 2 PBL winners last Friday. When I popped in to visit, there were huge smiles all around and they didn't want it to end.

School photos will still be on Friday August 21, and the purchase envelope will be sent home with students next Monday August 3.

We had a call from a community member last week expressing concern for some of our students. It was reported that was about 6 students in HPS uniform riding their scooters in the middle of Valley Rd. Two cars were approaching from either direction and the students stayed in the middle of the road forcing the cars to pull over. We regularly reinforce road and bike/scooter safety here at school and do not want an accident to occur with any of our students or anybody else. Please reinforce road safety rules at home and the dangers that this type of behaviour can lead to. Do not hesitate to contact the school if you would like to discuss this incident further.

As a school, we have opted in to participate in a new literacy and numeracy assessment package to further complement the suite of short assessments available. These assessments are to assist schools in identifying what students can do and to inform further teaching and learning. This is a 'check-in' assessment and designed to supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. This does not replace NAPLAN and there will not be a parent report as it for school based data practices only.

This week some of our executive staff will be participating in professional learning for the Leading Evaluation, Evidence and Data (LEED) capability building project. This project will support our school in the identification, refinement and implementation of evidence-informed practices for school improvement. Over three years, the project will support school executive in leading the implementation of evidence-informed practices, underpinned by evaluative thinking.

In regards to Covid-19, we will continue with all of the current procedures that were in place last term. This includes being vigilant around cleaning, good hygiene and sanitizing. If your child displays any symptoms of being unwell please keep them at home until the symptoms clear up. All non-essential visitors to the school are asked not to enter school grounds. We continue to be grateful for everyone's support during this time in assisting us to keep all of our students and staff as safe as we possibly can.

Survivor is an American rock band, formed in Chicago in 1978. The band achieved its greatest success in the 1980s, producing many charting singles, especially in the Use States. The band is best-known for its double-platim-certified in 1759 by the Tuger. The band continued to chart in the mid-1980s with 6 top 10 hts in the US. To date, the band has recorded 8 studies aburns and has gone through various line-up chardings.

Eye of the Tiger was released in 1982. It was the theme song for the motion picture Rocky III. It sold over 2 million copies in the US alone and held the number 1 position there for 6 weeks. Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need YOU to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.



#### No Parking

You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.







Do not stop or park on or near a marked crossing.





#### No Stopping

You are not permitted to stop on a length of road with a no stopping sign.





# **Driveways**

Do not stop on or across a driveway.

#### **Bus Zone**

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus.





#### Parallel Parking

metres of an intersection.

Must parallel park in direction of travel unless signpost states otherwise.





#### Mobile Phone Use

Do not use a hand held mobile phone while driving.

Just a reminder that the speed limit in school zones is 40km/h between 8 and 9:30 am and 2:30-4pm. So keep our kids safe, stick to the school zone speed limit and slow down. They're counting on you.
