Dear Families,

Welcome to Week 5 of Term 4. We have had some lovely recognition lately for the hard work we do here at school, with one parent writing to us to let us know that 'the transition back to school has been as smooth as possible' and that they are truly grateful their kids come here to HPS.

Stage 3 classes are currently discussing and planning some ideas of fun activities to replace the camp they missed out on. The students have come up with some good ideas so far, and staff will be researching these ideas in more detail during the week. So hopefully, we will have something more concrete to share with you next week.

The school canteen will be open starting next week (8/11/21) on Mondays and Fridays for online orders only. These orders need to be placed online through the QuickClik site. Students will not be able to bring money to spend at the canteen as it is not possible to co-ordinate canteen times and also ensure that student cohorts do not mix over the break periods.

There will be a new perpetual category presented at this year's Celebration of Learning ceremony. This award will be the 'Kathi Evans – Grow to Know – Academic Improvement' award and will be presented to a Year 6 student who has been part of the learning and support program and has made excellent progress in their academic learning. Kathi's husband, Bill, requested that we create a perpetual trophy to honour Kathi and the incredible work she did with those students at Hazelbrook Public School who found learning difficult. Kathi was pivotal in many students learning to read over the years, and we want to acknowledge how passionate she was about the students and student improvement. We feel privileged to create this perpetual category, and we are designing the award to represent some of the things Kathi loved.

Can I please implore parents and carers collecting students to maintain social distancing as per the NSW Health guidelines. We have noticed that many of our parents are not maintaining 1.5m distances, and without the use of masks, this makes it easier for the virus to spread. We are doing everything we can at school to minimise the chance of the virus on site, and we ask that you assist us in this by doing your part at collection time.

We are in the process of organising a representative sports shirt for families to purchase. The design for this is still in the beginning phase, and when we have some samples, we will ask for input from the school community. We aim to have this process completed before the end of the year so that the shirts can be made and purchased before the first representative sporting event next year.

Year 4 students will be able to participate in a workshop with Aboriginal artists Dalmarri in November. They will decorate some more poles on the Quad and the water tank in culturally relevant designs. This ongoing artistic project has been supported by our P&C over a few years now, and we are grateful for the financial support they provide.

Next year Ms Hendriksen is taking a year off to travel and to experience new adventures. Whilst she will miss the students, families and staff, she is very excited about her plans. We wish her a wonderful time and look forward to hearing all about it when she returns in 2023.




Returning Musical Instruments


Unfortunately, due to the Department of Education Covid-19 guidelines, Instrument tutorials and Band will not recommence this term.






News from the Office
