

Dear Families,

Welcome to Week 4 of Term 4. We were so excited to welcome back our fabulous Year 2 to 6 students on Monday. It was such a comforting feeling to hear the school full of children's voices and to be able to reconnect with all our amazing students. Thank you to our Year 2 to Year 6 parents for your massive role in home learning. We understand what an important and difficult job this was and appreciate all that you have done.

As part of the NSW Department of Education's COVID safe return to school plan, we must provide separate exits from the school for each stage. This will continue until the guidelines change. Whilst I understand that this can be frustrating for parents, it is nevertheless a requirement. Unfortunately, we are unable to make modifications to this for individual students, however all students can access Kiss and Drop.

Arrangements for exiting the school

Bus and Kiss and Drop remain as normal.

Kindergarten students will exit the school through the MMOOSH carpark gates, located on Hazelbrook Pde, no earlier than 3:10 pm each day.

Children will not be allowed to leave without their parent/caregiver, and staff will monitor this.

Stage 1 students will exit the school via the pedestrian gate, on Beechmount Ave, at 3 pm each day.

Children will not be allowed to leave without their parent/caregiver unless they have written permission to do so, and staff will monitor this.

Stage 2 students will exit the school via the Crecy gate, near the overhead bridge on the GWH, at 3 pm each

Stage 3 students will exit the school through the MMOOSH carpark gates, located on Hazelbrook Pde, at 3 pm each day.

If you have more than one child at our school, please advise them that they and their siblings need to exit through the gate allocated to your eldest child. Siblings will need to meet on the Quad before heading to the appropriate exit.

For those students riding bikes (scooters and skateboards do not apply to this message) they may exit out the pedestrian gate on Beechmount Ave, but they must wait until the Stage 1 students have exited. They will need to wait on Quad until a staff member indicates that it is safe to leave. This is to ensure the safety of all students.

Kindy are loving their playground, and it's almost like the first time they got to play there. Amazing what four months away from school can do for your excitement levels. It's a little bit like putting away a toy for a few months and then bringing it back out again!

Year 5 is in leadership training, and soon we will be involved in electing our student representative council and other leadership positions. This is an exciting and daunting time in their schooling career as all Year 5 students are encouraged to take a leadership role within the school, in a variety of formats, to suit their strengths and interests.

We were very pleased to hear the news from the NSW Department of Education late last week that we can have a Year 6 formal. This will be on-site, with COVID restrictions similar to last year. More information will be provided to Year 6 parents shortly, but for the moment, we are just happy that this important event can be held!

Our Celebration of Learning, with a combined Year 6 graduation ceremony, will also be able to be held this year but, at this point, will be restricted to students and staff on site. Photos of your child receiving recognition will be taken and made available through class teachers. More information will be provided about this closer to the date.

Please take care, look after your health and well-being, and remember we are only a phone call away and are happy to assist in whatever way we can.

The plant sale will hopefully be held locally on a weekend in November (not at school). Details TBA very soon!


We will also be calling out for volunteers to assist at the plant sale.

Nominations for the Multi-Aged Class are NOW OPEN

The current Multi-Aged Class (or MAC) structure was established in 2017 to provide appropriate extension and enrichment learning for high potential and gifted students. It continues to build on Hazelbrook Public School's deep commitment to meeting the needs of all learners and our history of supporting high achieving students, which goes back to when the first multi-aged class was formed in 2007.

The new Department of Education High Potential and Gifted Education Policy commenced implementation this year. Staff have received initial professional learning on the key concepts of this policy, and further professional learning will occur as the policy is implemented. The guiding principles of the policy are as follows:

- Regardless of background or personal circumstances, all students require access to learning programs that meet their learning needs and support to aspire to and achieve personal excellence.
- Our commitment to high expectations for all students includes high potential and gifted students.
- Achieving excellence for high potential and gifted students is underpinned by effective school environments, including quality teaching, learning and leadership.

The MAC program has included students from Year 2-6 in 2017, 2018 and 2021 and students from 3-6 in 2019 and 2020. The class provides extension and enrichment through:

- curriculum compaction,
- adjusted learning experiences that are faster paced and involve less repetition and practice,
- adjusted learning experiences that are self-directed and open-ended,
- collaboration across ages and stages,
- focus on higher-order thinking,
- real-world problem solving and
- participation in broader programs such as the Tournament of Minds (2017), Maths Cup (2017), Waterbug Blitz (2019), the Maker Space Tour at WSU (2019) Lachlan Macquarie Maths Competition (2019) and the Australian Maths Competition (2019).

Students can be nominated for the class by teachers, parents, or they can self-nominate. The nomination process involves completing surveys and questionnaires compiled with standardised and non-standardised assessments and student work samples. Parents will be notified if their child is nominated by their teacher.

Students in the current MAC program have the opportunity to retain their place in the class without further nomination. New places are made available by Year 6 students graduating to high school and any students who choose to return to the mixed ability setting. A waiting list is also created as places may become available during the year.

If you wish to nominate your child to be considered for the MAC program, please access the nomination form from the Parent Portal or phone the office, and they will send one home with your child.

Please return the completed forms to the office by the end of Week 4 (29/10/21).

The Opportunity Test placement test will take place for our students at Hazelbrook Public School. The illness / misadventure and appeals process will not be available. School travel for 2022



2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2022.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

School Student Transport Scheme site change

On 1 October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to transportnsw.info. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one place.

Travel from Term 1 2022

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a difficult period for local bus operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations increasingly difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mear they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel on a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Please also remember that students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use
